



Carl Edward Sleasman

November 19, 1930 - March 4, 2021

Carl Edward Sleasman, 90, of Indian Head, died peacefully at Alle Kiski Select Specialty Hospital on March 4, 2021 from complications of COVID. Carl was born in Indian Head on November 19, 1930 to the late Grover and Ada (Channing) Sleasman. Carl was a graduate from Connellsville High School in 1948, Findlay College (now University of Findlay) in 1952 with a B.A. Degree and the University of Pittsburgh in 1958 with his Masters of Education. He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict from 1952-1954 as a Supply Sergeant, reaching the rank of Sergeant First Class. Carl taught in Saltlick Township from 1954 - 1956. From 1956-1992 he taught in the Connellsville School District, mainly teaching U.S. History at Jr. High East. Carl was an active member of the Indian Head Church of God where he served as an elder, choir member, Sunday School Teacher and Superintendent. He was also active in the Allegheny Region of Churches of God where he served in various roles including as a member of the Camp Sunrise Mountain Board of Directors. Carl was a member of the Indian Creek Valley Lions Club since 1956 and was also a member of the Valley VFW #12019.

Carl is survived by his daughters April Linnell of Indian Head, Hope(Brian) Dull of Mill Run, and son Brent (Julie) Sleasman of Findlay, OH.; grandchildren Joshua and Amy Linnell, Zoe, Dahlelson, and Ellie Sleasman, and Aiden, Zakarah, and Chase Dull; great granddaughter Lily Darnell; brothers Frank (Janis) Sleasman of Manchester, New Hampshire and Earl (Donna) Sleasman

of Pittsburgh. In addition to his parents, he is predeceased by his wife Evangeline, brothers Dale, Merle, and Glenn, and sister Ruth Francisco. A special thanks to Frick Hospital Staff and Alle Kiski Select Specialty Hospital for their loving care and support.
